

Hi everybody I hope everybody is keeping safe and well. Thanks to all the people who have submitted work for me to correct. This week I'm going to give some extra work in Maths, Irish and English. On Tuesday this week the class will be doing a small bit of Algebra which involves working with patterns as they appear in numbers and sequences in Maths. Finding patterns in Maths involves.

- First looking at the sequence and seeing if you can notice a pattern,
- Then if the pattern is not noticeable at first you can recite the pattern to see if there is a noticeable repetitive tone to the sequence
- Finally, then skip counting and writing down the difference in the sequence as you go will also help the child to figure out the pattern.

3rd Class in their worksheet will have to work out patterns in shapes and symbols whereas 4th class will have to work out a pattern with shapes symbols and also numbers. I have included the answers to both worksheets in this week's work to assist you.

On Wednesday, the children will have to read through a short Irish story An Turas Scoile (The School Tour) based on the theme Caitheamh Aimsire and then answer An Turas Scoile Ceisteanna there are again 4 questions based on the story.

Finally, on Thursday for English I would like the children to try a small bit of poetry writing. We will be studying Limericks. As a precursor to the lesson it would be a good idea to watch Múinteoir John's lesson on Home School Hub as he gave an excellent lesson on how to write a Limerick. It is Lesson 23 from 3rd and 4th class. A Limerick is a humorous 5 line poem. Lines 1, 2 and 5 should rhyme with each other and then line 3 and 4 should rhyme with each other. (Usually lines 1, 2 and 5 have nine syllables and line 3 and 4 have five syllables but don't feel under too much pressure to be dead exact with the syllable count as it can hinder the fun!!!) Usually the first line of a Limerick starts off with the line "There once was a _ _ _" I've include an example below to help

There once was a very sad **daddy**

Whose golf game was going quiet **badly**

He looked left and **right**

No ball was in **sight**

I think that he needed a **caddy**

You can send me the children's completed Limerick and Gaeilge work on Friday and I will correct and provide some feedback to you about it. My email is david.doyle@aughacaslans.com.
