Hi everybody I hope everybody is keeping safe and well. Thanks to all the people who have submitted work for me to correct. This week I'm going to give some extra work in Maths, Irish and Science.

In maths this week 4<sup>th</sup> class will be doing number sentences. This is basic algebra where the children will be filling in the blanks to make the number sentence true or balance. In question 1 you have a boy trying to balance a scale evenly. The left side has a number and a blank box. On the right side there is another number which you can take as the answer. You must figure out what goes into the blank box to give the same number on the left as on the right. In question 2 it's the same process where you must fill in the blank. Sometimes instead of just looking at the sum it can be helpful to say the line "What can you add to 3 to give me 11?" or you can change the symbol on the left to its opposite so if it's a + this changes to a – and vice versa. Then if you take 3 away from 11 this will give you the missing number. Then finally in question 3 and 4 you must fill in the blank boxes in the number sentences to give you the exact number after the equals sign.

In Irish we are going to be continuing the theme of Caitheamh Aimsire. I have included a screen shot of an exercise I want the children to do. They have to finish the sentences. (Críochnaigh na habairtí) The sentence is Tá mé go maith ag \_\_\_\_\_\_ (I am good at \_\_\_\_\_\_) You then match the picture with the words on top. Underneath you will see a star at the bottom this is where the children say what hobby they are good at. Tá mise go maith ag \_\_\_\_\_\_. You can use the words on the page, or you can use the hobbies from the power point I gave you a few weeks ago to help also.

Finally for Weds and Thursday I have included a screen shot of the children's Small World Geography and Science chapter on The Human Body. On Weds I'd just like the children to read through the chapter. Its quite extensive. You can go through the activities orally with your child there is no need to write out the answers as there is a lot of work to answer these. Then on Thursday I'd like the children to write a report on The Human Body based on what they have read from the chapter under the following headings

- Your Skeleton
- Your Bones and Joints
- Your Teeth and your Tongue
- The importance of a balanced diet

I have included a Report writing frame which can be useful to plan the report before your child writes it.

You can send me the children's completed reports, their Irish, and their Maths worksheet on Friday and I will correct and provide some feedback to you about them. Students can again handwrite the report or if it's easier they can type it up instead. My email is <u>david.doyle@aughacaslans.com</u>. All the work I set including this extra work is completely optional and is at the discretion of you the parent it is not intended to add any extra pressure to you or your child and you are under no obligation to complete it.
