<u>Junior Infant's Work 8/6/20 - 12/6/20</u>

Dear Parents,

I hope you are all keeping safe and well. This document outlines the children's work for the coming week. As always, the outlined work remains optional. Here are some general notes on the work I have selected. Following this will be a daily guideline as to how the work can be approached.

Maths: This week Junior Infants will be learning about numbers that go before, after and between other numbers. We need to make sure that children have a clear understanding of what exactly <u>before and after</u> means before attempting the 'Busy at Maths' pages. The following activities should help:

- -Talk to your child about things she/he does before/after/between significant events in his/her day e.g. What do you do before you get dressed in the morning? (I wake up/jump out of bed). What do you after you get dressed? (I walk to the bathroom and brush my teeth).
- -Place numerals 0 5 on the table in random order (you can write them on postit notes). Ask your child to arrange the numerals in order from 0 5.

Ask the following questions;

Which number comes just after 2, 3, 4 etc?

Which number comes between 2 and 4?

Which number comes before 1, 2, 3 etc?

Which number comes two places before 3?

Which number comes two places after 3?

Which number comes between 0 and 2?
