Dear Parents,

I hope you are all keeping safe and well. This document outlines the children's work for the coming week. As always, the outlined work remains optional. Here are some general notes on the work I have selected. Following this will be a daily guideline as to how the work can be approached.

Spelling Test: shark, ark, dark, park, car, star, arm

Maths: This week senior infants are learning about capacity (the measure of the amount of water etc. different containers can hold). The best way to teach it is to allow your child to fill and empty a range of containers that are at hand in the home. On page 118 of 'Busy at Maths' it uses a bowl, teapot, bottle and a pot. They can be filled with cups – allow them to estimate (guess) each time how many cups of water each container holds.
